STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE:	The City Council should receive a legal opinion for the City Attorney's Office regarding the legality of staff awarding and transferring city property without approval from the City Council.
RECOMMENDED ACTION:	RECEIVE a report from the City Attorney regarding the legality of staff awarding and transferring city property without approval from the City Council - Councilmember Nathaniel Bates (510-620-6743).

DISCUSSION:

At its April 19, 2022, meeting, the City Council considered an ordinance amending RMC Chapter 12.30 ("Video Service Provider, Utility and Special District Encroachments") by incorporating Chapter 12.29 ("Street Opening and Pavement Restoration Regulations"); adding provisions that address private landowner encroachments into the public Right-of-Way (ROW); easements; and street vacations; retitling Chapter 12.30 "Encroachments and Easements," and rescinding Chapter 12.29 in its entirety.

The City Council should receive a report from the City Attorney's Office regarding the legality of staff awarding and transferring city property without approval from the City Council.
