## DISCUSSION:

The Community Police Review Commission (CPRC) is concerned about the number of police officers that are retiring and the lack of applications from potential candidates. At the July 6, 2022, meeting, the CPRC approved a motion by a vote of 4-2 to recommend

that City Council work together with the Richmond Police Association, Richmond Police Management Association, and the Richmond Fire Department to come to an agreement that benefits the broader community and makes sure it serves the community as a whole.
