WHL / MSL

- 800 Peer Leaders have graduated from our yearlong program since its start in 2000
- Transformative Process
- Social Responsibility: Each Leader develops a learning project to address a need in their community
- 35,000 community members reached through learning projects

Young Latin Future Leaders (YLFL)

- 406 Middle & High School Students have participated in our program since its start in 2009
- Provides Latino youth with leadership development, peer support, mentoring, and advocacy training to improve their quality of life and academic success
- Social Responsibility
- Designed to support self-esteem and health



Our **YLFL** youth led a successful campaign to preserve the jobs of WCCUSD School Community Outreach Workers (SCOWs) this month. They wrote a letter, collected 653 signatures (576 students, 51 parents, etc.) and presented it on 3/15 to the WCCUSD Board.



Ya Basta! / Enough! Program

- Domestic Violence prevention and intervention program
- **1320**+ survivors of domestic violence served
- Provides education, support, and training on how we can together end family violence in our Latino community.
- The Caminos Al Apoyo Support Group is for women who have experienced physical, emotional, and/or sexual violence.
- Our Celebrating Recovery Support Group is a 12-step program for survivors of domestic violence seeking inner peace.

Our Children First / Primero Nuestro Niños

- 4200 parents trained through the program since it started in
 2008
- The program offers a Parenting School (Escuela de Padres), which uses the evidence-based curriculum STEP (Systematic Training for Effective Parenting). The school teaches Latino parents how to support the healthy emotional, social, and educational development of their children.
- This program is a part of our **Mental Health Services** and, through it, we make referrals for support and treatment including individual therapy



Microenterprise / Microempresas

- Our program provides classes, workshops, technical assistance, small grants, a peer network, and other support to help entrepreneurial Latinos succeed.
- We help entrepreneurs develop a business plan, generate financial projections, identify potential lenders, prepare loan applications, and create strategic marketing tools.



Legal Advice

- Monthly free consultations with an Immigration Lawyer
- We provide Legal Advice related to immigration, U-Visa, and VAWA (Violence Against Women Act). VAWA is legislation, first passed in 1994, that creates and supports comprehensive, cost-effective responses to domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, and stalking.
