






Diversity

Our average Parent Rating is 4.94 out of 5 Stars from more than 280,000 total ratings.

Our industry-leading technology platform further delivers unprecedented transparency and a data-driven approach through access to real-time performance, ridership, safety, and other relevant data in easy-to-understand dashboards. This data not only provides the optimal experience for all parties but allows for continual improvement to the platform. Our focus on data means that we are equally focused on data privacy and security.

Driver App

Zūm drivers appreciate our comprehensive, end-to-end software solution as it ensures drivers' routes are managed efficiently and drivers are notified of any last-minute route changes right away via push notifications sent directly to their Driver Tablet. The Zūm platform seamlessly tracks an extensive set of data including daily ridership for each route, rider attendance, pick up and drop off times for each stop, and on time performance for each ride, which eliminates cumbersome paper-based reporting for drivers and printing of paper-based route sheets when last minute changes are made.

The tablets with our driver app provide drivers with GPS directions, monitor ridership, and provide employee (driver and monitor) time tracking functionality. Tablets allow drivers to receive real-time route updates, communicate with dispatch, check riders in/out, see helpful rider information and stop assignments, and follow turn-by-turn directions to stops.



Buses will be equipped with a compliant camera system from Gatekeeper to ensure rider safety. Gatekeeper's high-definition, compact cameras are built to work in harsh conditions. The cameras provide exceptional picture quality in any light, even no light. Features include:

- Video/Audio recording with electronic access to view and store, as required, data from functional digital video cameras
- 4-Channel System
- H.264 Compression for Images
- Up to 320GB memory storage
- Records at 30FPS at 720 x 480 resolution
- Simple and Friendly User-Interface
- Simple and Friendly User-Interface

We provide Netradyne Driver on our buses, which helps drivers remain focused on safety, and consistently monitor their own driving behaviors to identify areas of strength and opportunities for improvement. This technology also keeps drivers and riders safe from accidents, and offers documentation when questions arise regarding driver or rider behavior on the bus. As such, video footage and GPS tracking data provides helpful documentation of what really happened, which can be critical to protect drivers in the event of an accident or false claims made against them.



Each Zūm bus will be equipped with a minimum of four (4) digital video cameras to record images from the following vantage points:

- Front to back
- · Back to front
- Front exterior
- Exit stairwell

Footage from the aforementioned cameras will be digitally recorded and accurately display the date, time of recording, and bus number. The cameras we propose are capable of providing clear color video recordings of the entire interior and front exterior of the bus with simultaneous audio recordings. Recordings will document the entire daily trip (morning and afternoon) without overwriting any previously recorded information from that trip. Upon request from Richmond, the video recordings will blur out rider faces.







Driver Training

We invest in our team and our client relationships by providing high quality, effective, and appropriate training for all positions including vehicle operators and monitors. We realize that in transportation, training really comes into play when the "rubber meets the road." A great day begins with a good attitude, good training, and most of all, compassion for passengers.

Zūm will meet all training qualifications as outlined by federal, state, and local law and regulations for transportation. We require employees to participate in a classroom training program with emphasis on safety basics, rider management, and logistics such as intersections and danger zones. Zūm will maintain a file on training which will be available to the city upon request. We also require behind-thewheel training.

Once the classroom training is completed, drivers will graduate to behind-the-wheel training. Our behind-the-wheel training will focus on real-life situations. This starts with ensuring that the driver knows the equipment he or she will be using. Drivers must know the seat adjustments for the most ergonomic position, mirror grid of the bus for maximum visibility, all the gauges and controls, and most importantly operating all the emergency equipment and emergency exits.

Defensive Driving Program

We require all our drivers to take defensive driving courses. Our certified trainers teach drivers to avoid accidents and to be prepared for various traffic situations. The principles help to maintain a safe amount of room around the vehicle, improve visibility, and provide extra time to make decisions while driving.



Random safety audits are built into our safety calendar.

Safety

Zūm protocols and driver training reinforce safety from the moment our drivers step into their vehicle preparing to pick up students to the moment the students walk through the doors of their drop off location. Zūm's mission is to ensure that our students and their families always feel as though their safety is a given, not a hope. Zūm strives to accomplish this through our two-pronged safety approach:

 Our rigorous, uncompromising safety standards are palpable in everything we do from our
 driver screening, training, and evaluation to our emergency procedures. Upholding high

Safety Committee Review

The Safety Manager will review the meeting minutes after each Safety Committee meeting to extract action items to discuss with the General Manager and Shop Manager to recommend improvements and ultimately take corrective action to improve the safety of our operation, employees and the community as a whole. We at Zūm are biased to action and will address any concerns as soon as practicable. Actions taken as a result of concerns brought up by the Safety Committee will be documented and shared at the next Safety Committee meeting so as to demonstrate our commitment to safety. Since we are proactive about the safety of our employees and students we transport, the Safety Committee is yet another reason that makes Zūm a Great Place to Work!

Safety Committee Training

To prepare for its important role, the committee undergoes targeted training. The Area Director of Safety assists with instruction on a range of topics, including determination of accident/injury root cause, safety incentive programs, safety communication programs, facility safety inspections, hazard identification and correction, safety policies and procedures, and group dynamics.

Safety Processes

Driver and Vehicle Safety Database with Routine Audits & Training

Zūm's operation, training, and technology is built upon a robust Driver Safety and Vehicle Safety Database. This database provides full visibility to track and monitor driver qualifications and certifications, ensuring no driver begins or provides service without proper qualifications and that all drivers and vehicles meet or exceed state and federal requirements. Ride Safety Protocols

In addition to Safety Training Programs mentioned above, drivers are required to adhere to our Safety Protocols when students are riding in or are loading or unloading from a vehicle as included below:

Pick-Up Protocol

- Drivers are only allowed to pick up students at designated bus stops or pick-up locations
- Züm's proprietary technology ensures that most students are routed as right-side pickups
- The vehicle is permitted to start moving only once all students are seated and have their seat belts buckled
- The driver is responsible for all students on the bus. If an aide is required, they can assist the driver to facilitate the needs of the students.
- For rides in passenger vehicles, students are permitted to enter vehicles only when the vehicle has come to a complete stop and is within 18 inches of the pick-up location's curb. Students can only enter via a curbside door.

En Route Protocol

- Drivers will not use mobile devices at any point during the ride, unless when pulled over during an emergency situation
- No food should be consumed in the vehicle while the driver is completing a ride for Zūm, unless it is a special requirement for the rider
- No music or radios shows should be played during a ride, unless it is a special requirement for the rider

I have closely worked with the Zūm team over the last 4 years, and have observed firsthand the benefit of their robust operations, technology-enabled transparency and data driven reporting. This is definitely the new era of Student Transportation.

- Impacted Routes: With their previous provider, the District used to face severe performance challenges of daily routes categorized as "impacted rides" because of drivers call out or no show, where either these rides were entirely canceled for the day, or the routes used to run with extreme delays. Zūm has reduced the average number of impacted routes to 0.2%.
- Student Ridership: Ridership on buses has gone up from the low 40% on average to the high 70%.
- Student Ride Time: Average ride time for SFUSD students, which used to be over 50 minutes, has been
 reduced to 30 minutes or below on average, per child.
- Optimization: Previously the district was using a fleet of 236 school buses, which Zūm was able to
 optimize to 193 school buses, saving the district over \$3M a year or \$15M over 5 years of the primary
 term. The District has used these savings to add 10 more routes, allowing SFUSD to provide
 transportation services to additional students this year.
- Electrification: We have already started work with SFUSD on electrification, and are in the advanced stages of utility approvals, and grant applications. Zūm is on track to electrify 100% of SFUSD's school bus fleet by 2025.

2. Profile on the Proposing Firm

Our main office and bus yard is in Richmond, California. A few of our subcontractors that we do business with include Busloop, United Coach Tours, and Bay Area Executive Transportation, Alexandra Tours, DHarris Tours, Ellie Charters, Bus.Com. They are all bus companies that provide chartered bus transportation like our company.

accessible vehicles to help assist passengers that need to be lifted with a wheelchair or walkers.

Our company also provides transportation for local schools for their Athletics trips and field trips which include all sports games and practices, prom events, senior field trips and Grad Night's to Disneyland, Universal Studios, Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk, and many local venues. We have provided bus transportation services for their summer camp providing services for all their summer camp locations in Richmond, Ca - transporting them to various sites including snow trips, Antioch Water Park, Six Flags Discovery Kingdom, Six Flags Hurricane Harbor (formally known as Water World), and various sites.

4. Work Plan/Proposal

Our company's goal is to fulfill and accommodate the service needs of the City of Richmond. We have much experience in satisfying the objective and work requirements since have done similar work for multiple school shuttles. If awarded, we will accept bus requests from the City of Richmond that will need to include the following information- Date of trip, total number of passengers, pickup time, pickup location/address, destination location/address, and departure time from destination. This can be sent via email preferably or over the phone. A Charter Quotation will be sent before confirming the trip, followed by a Confirmation for each trip. Trips will be confirmed a week before each trip. Once the trips are confirmed, a driver will be dispatched the day prior to the trip.

5. Proposed Innovations

We suggest that bus requests be made at least 2-3 weeks in advance to ensure availability. We are very flexible and can even accommodate last-minute requests up to the day before if the trip is needed. There have been cases where we have been able to accommodate trips on the same day in case a site forgets to book a bus, based on availability.

We can confirm trips via phone or email the day prior to each site to confirm the pickup/drop off times and passenger counts. This has been very helpful in our experience to accommodate our client's needs.

As far as marketing to potential and current clients, we suggest promoting the shuttle services to the Richmond area schools directly through flyers, emails, and announcements to ensure the students can utilize this after school program to their benefit.

All our vehicles are equipped with GPS units so we can locate the location of our buses, track how fast the buses are going (mph), and report to our clients the status of their bus.

6. Project Staffing

Our Operations Manager, Tracy Fernandez, oversees dispatching all bus trips. She oversees assigning and scheduling drivers for bus trips daily. Once a bus trip is confirmed, a driver will be assigned their job the day before the trip. Scheduling is based on time frames and locations of the trips as well as availability of drivers. She started working for Eastshore Charter Lines in 2008 and continued with Bay Area Charters when the company moved to Richmond in 2014 to current.




