Subject:	Authorization for International Travel to Sister City Regla, Cuba
FINANCIAL IMPACT:	\$18,000 for land cost and airfare for 5 city travelers for 10 days. The individual appropriations for the Mayor, Councilmembers and staff have funding to cover the cost. The per person cost is estimated at \$3,600. PREVIOUS COUNCIL ACTION:	The City Council approved travel in 2013 and 1999.
STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE:	The City of Richmond entered into a sister city agreement in 1999. 2024 marks the 25 th year of the friendship.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:	APPROVE the request for international travel to Sister City Regla, Cuba, from December 5-15, 2024, for Mayor Eduardo Martinez, Vice Mayor Claudia Jimenez, Councilmember Cesar Zepeda and staff members Trina Jackson-Lincoln and Tony Tamayo - Mayor Eduardo Martinez (510-620-6503).

DISCUSSION:

In celebration of 25 years of friendship and solidarity between Richmond, California and Regla, Cuba, the Richmond-Regla Friendship Committee is planning a delegation to visit our dear friendship city in December 2024. The delegation will be led by Mayor Eduardo Martinez and will include City Council Members, the Richmond Regla Friendship Committee, and community members.

In consideration of the Richmond City Council's Resolution No. 147-99 which established a Friendship City relationship between Richmond, California and Regla, Cuba for the exchange of mutual beneficial ideas and the sharing of cultural, educational, humanitarian and municipal resources, the purpose of the trip is to visit and extend ongoing friendship to current officials and residents of Regla, Cuba.

If approved, this will be the third official City of Richmond delegation to visit Regla, following the initial visit in December 1999 led by Vice-Mayor Irma Anderson, and the second visit in December 2013 led by Mayor Gayle McLaughlin.

The Mayor and committee look forward to exchanges with our Cuban counterparts in the fields of health, education, the arts, and sustainability. In addition to the rich exchange of ideas, the delegation hopes to bring educational and humanitarian supplies. The creation of our Richmond Regla Friendship Committee was inspired by the People-to-People Ambassador Program created by President Eisenhower in 1956. We look forward to continuing to build bridges of exchange between our friendship cities for mutual benefit.
