Council Report April 2025

Mayor Martinez, Council, and Community,

The Richmond Police Department's crime statistics for April 2025 show a mixed trend in both violent and property crimes compared to March 2025.

In terms of violent crime, our total homicides for the year remain at zero. Aggravated assaults increased by 20%, from 66 to 79 incidents. Robberies decreased 31%, decreasing from 29 to 20 incidents. Sexual assaults also decreased by 17%, decreasing from 12 to 10 incidents. Overall, the total number of violent crimes increased by 2% from 107 to 109 incidents.

For property crimes, there was a 9% decrease in burglaries (excluding auto burglaries), with incidents decreasing from 35 to 32. Thefts, including auto burglaries, decreased by 6%, from 123 to 116 incidents. Vehicle thefts also decreased by 33%, dropping from 88 to 59 incidents. Arson incidents increased by 20%, increasing from 5 to 6 incidents. Overall, the total number of property crimes decreased by 15%, from 251 to 213 incidents.

Our calls for service indicate a 47% increase in impounds, increasing from 242 to 357. This increase can be attributed to a tow enforcement operation targeting abandoned vehicles in the city's southern district on April 23rd. 74 vehicles were towed during the operation. Collision-related calls for service decreased by 7%, from 150 to 140. DUI-related traffic collisions saw no change, with 6 reported incidents, and DUI reports increased slightly by 4%, from 23 to 24. Sideshow-related calls for service decreased significantly by 67%, declining from 3 to 1 incident. The total number of firearms recovered dramatically increased by 127%, from 11 to 25. District 1 saw a 5.56% decrease in total calls for service, dropping from 1,584 calls to 1,496. District 2 saw a 2.47% decrease in total calls for service, decreasing from 1,499 calls to 1,462. District 3 saw a .65% increase in total calls for service, increasing from 1,702 calls to 1,713. District 4 saw a 4.8% decrease in total calls for service, dropping from 521 calls to 496. District 5 saw a 2.67% increase in total calls for service, increasing from 1,198 calls to 1,230. District 6 saw a 1.71% decrease in total calls for service, dropping from 994 calls to 977.

Additionally, the following are a sampling of some significant incidents from April 2025.

4/2/25

Ice Cream Bandit Grand Theft Suspect arrested 4100 block Meeker Ave

The same suspect would enter the CVS store for several weeks and steal shopping carts full of ice cream. The suspect would return days in a row, and while committing the thefts, vowed to return to steal more ice cream the following day. The suspect stole over \$10,000.00 in ice cream over various days. Using FLOCK cameras, officers were able to locate the suspect vehicle's license plate. On 4/2/25, the suspect's vehicle was located, and he was taken into custody. The suspect admitted to the thefts and selling his stolen ice cream to other businesses.

4/15/25

Marijuana Grow and Firearms Seizure 4500 block McGlothen Way

Officers authored a search warrant for a suspected marijuana grow. Officers served the search warrant and recovered numerous marijuana plants along with 4 illegal assault rifles, magazines, and ammunition.

4/19/25

Firearms arrest 2900 block Center Ave

Officers stopped a vehicle for vehicle code violations, including expired registration for more than six months. While towing the vehicle for expired registration, two loaded firearms were located. One firearm was fitted with a rapid-fire "switch" that allowed it to be fired fully automatic.

4/22/25

Attempted Armed Carjacking and standoff 2900 block of San Luis Ave.

Officers responded to a report of an armed attempted carjacking. The victim was able to drive away from the suspects and avoid having their vehicle stolen. Officers checked the area and located the suspects in the 2900 block of San Luis Ave. Officers attempted to contact the three suspects, but they fled. One suspect was taken into custody after climbing on the roof of a residence. One suspect was able to get outside of the perimeter that officers had established. A third suspect fled into a residence in the 2900 block of San Luis Ave. Officers could see additional people inside the residence and tried to order them outside. All occupants refused to

cooperate or follow the officers' orders. A search warrant was obtained, and tactical teams responded due to a firearm being used. After several hours, officers were able to get the occupants to exit the home, detaining one additional suspect.
