## DISCUSSION:

With over 25 years of experience in the healthcare sector and more than two decades of community service, Bryan M. Harris is highly qualified to serve on the Contra Costa

County Advisory Council on Aging (ACOA). He holds a Master's degree in Gerontology, which led to an internship with the Richmond Commission on Aging and the start of his career in public service with the City of Richmond. He later returned to the nursing field, teaching at his alma mater and serving eight years as a home healthcare nurse with the Contra Costa County Public Health Division. In 2022, he was recruited to serve on Alameda County's Oakland Transitional Grant Area Planning Council (Ryan White/Health Resources and Services Administration), where he holds multiple leadership roles, including Vice-Chair. In 2023, he was also appointed to the Richmond Commission on Aging, where he continues to lead impactful programs and events that support and advocate for seniors in his community.
