Background and Qualifications

Proposed Scope of Work

(Task 1) - Cost Recovery Analysis

SCI will conduct a cost recovery analysis to review and update the City's existing cannabis fee structure to ensure full cost recovery for expenses incurred by the City related to each step of the cannabis application, permitting, and regulatory process. The goal is to establish a reliable, robust cannabis fee structure that is supported by the community and the local cannabis industry, is Proposition 26 justifiable, and adheres to all State and local regulations.

Deliverables:

- Develop Cannabis Regulatory Fees
- Prepare Resolution, Staff Report, and Supporting Documentation for Council Adoption

(Task 2) - Ordinance Amendments

SCI will develop an ordinance amending the City's existing municipal code related to commercial cannabis activity to address changes to the City's regulatory process associated with the establishment of the City's Cannabis Equity Program. The ordinance will address changes associated with the number and types of cannabis businesses, location and setback requirements, and the application review and selection process. We will carefully research our work to be compliant with all local and State laws and regulations, and the final ordinance will be reviewed by the City's legal counsel prior to implementation. Finally, we will help shepherd the ordinance through the approval process.

Deliverables:

- Develop Ordinance Amendments
- Prepare Resolution, Staff Report, and Supporting Documentation for Council Adoption
- Attend Council Meetings

(Task 3) - Equity Application and Scoring Criteria

SCI will develop and design a transparent and fair application process for the evaluation, ranking, and selection of cannabis equity applicants. Our goal for this task is to provide the City with a fair model of selection that favors equity, community safety, longevity, and sustainability. We want to ensure that as part of the application process, the applicant is completely familiar with the application process, and understands the potential time and financial investment and the regulatory process. SCI will develop application procedures and guidelines, application forms, and all other required documents.

Deliverables:

- Develop Equity Program Eligibility Application Form
- Develop Competitive Application, Review Process, & Selection Criteria
