STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE:	The proposed resolution initiates the process for the annual levy of a benefit assessment for the Hilltop Landscape Maintenance District by ordering the preparation of the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Engineer's Report for this District

DISCUSSION:

On June 23, 1998, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 91-98, approving the Engineer's Report, establishing the rate of assessment, authorizing annual increases thereof, and ordering maintenance services within the Hilltop Landscape Maintenance District. The rate of assessment for this District must be confirmed annually by action of the City Council.

In accordance with Section 12.60.240 of the Richmond Municipal Code, and in accordance with State law, the first step in this process is to order the preparation of an Engineer's Report of assessment for the 2022-2023 fiscal year. As required by Section 12.060.250 of the Richmond Municipal Code, a copy of the report and a property owner response form will be mailed to all owners of real property subject to the annual benefit assessment as a subsequent part of the process. The City Council will be asked to hold a public hearing and accept the Engineer's Report to then finalize the process.
