STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE:	City staff is requesting City Council to adopt a resolution to accept and appropriate grant funds in the amount of \$100,000 from PG&E to create power hubs at Nevin and Shields-Reid Community Centers.

DISCUSSION:

The City of Richmond Community Services Department – Recreation Division was awarded the PG&E Resilience Hubs grant award in the amount of \$100,000 to create power hubs at Nevin and Shields-Reid Community Centers. With the Resilience Hubs grant, backup energy supplies will be created to allow the facilities to function as resilience hubs in times of climate-related disasters.

The project will also support the PG&E Better Together Resilient Communities grant that was awarded to the City on November 30, 2021. With the Better Together Resilient Communities grant, temporary shade and cooling structures with misting nozzles will be created. The Resilience Hubs grant will be used to create storage for the structures.

City staff is requesting City Council to adopt a resolution to accept and appropriate the Resilience Hubs grant funds and adjust the FY2021-2022 revenues and expenditures by \$100,000.
