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DISCUSSION:

In 2021, the Employment and Training Division of the Community Services Department was awarded additional grant funds in the amount of \$250,000 from the State of California Employment Development Department's (EDD) Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Governor's Discretionary funds. The funds were awarded to provide "earn and learn" opportunities for unemployed youth workers through paid work experience and apprenticeships in occupations with career pathways. Key partners in this grant program include Bitwise Industries, Family Justice Center, Kaiser School of Allied Health, Richmond's Literacy for Every Adult Program (LEAP), RichmondBUILD, and many other Richmond organizations.

The \$250,000 will be used to serve Richmond youth who lost their jobs through no fault of their own and who are participating in the State's Dislocated Youth Worker Innovation Challenge (DYWIC) program.

This grant was awarded after the City adopted the FY 2021-2022 budget, and therefore, a resolution amending the budget is necessary for the Employment and Training division to be able to accept and appropriate these funds.
