

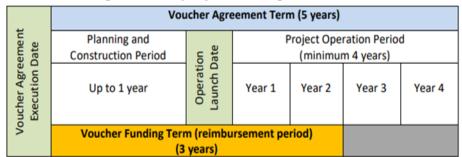

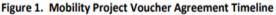

DATE: April 5, 2022 Mayor Butt and Members of the City Council TO: FROM: LaShonda White, Interim Director of Library and **Community Services** Denée Evans, Transportation Services Project Manager Richmond Electric Shuttle Service Contract Amendment Subject: FINANCIAL IMPACT: In FY 2021-2022, the Richmond City Council approved the ECIA Transportation budget to fund services for seniors and disabled persons residing in Richmond and support shuttle services. The cash match will support additional on-demand services for this population as required under Title VII (11731013 400201 2A1JL). **PREVIOUS COUNCIL** July 6, 2021 ACTION: STATEMENT OF THE The City of Richmond in collaboration with Via ISSUE: Transportation will launch an electric vehicle shuttle in April 2022 with grant funds supported by the Clean Mobility Options Voucher Pilot Program. **RECOMMENDED ACTION:** APPROVE a contract amendment with Nomad Transit. LLC (dba Via Transportation, Inc.) in the amount of \$338,231, for a not to exceed total of \$1,338,231, as a cash match to support the grant funded Clean Mobility Options Project Voucher Pilot Program - Library and Community Services Department (LaShonda White/ Denée Evans 510-621-1718).

DISCUSSION:

On July 6, 2021, City Council adopted a resolution authorizing the city manager to execute a funding agreement between the City of Richmond and the State of California Air Resources Board (CARB) Clean Mobility Options Project Voucher Pilot Program (CMO) to appropriate the voucher program funds in the amount of \$1,000,000 and approve a three-year service contract with Via Transportation to develop and operate the city's first on demand local electric shuttle service. The CMO program funds provide awardees one year of planning and development of the program followed by two years of operations, and awardees are required to find funding for years 3 and 4 (see figure 1 below).





Addressing Increased Cost and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Compliance During the planning and construction period, it was determined that additional funding was required. Vehicle lease costs have increased due to the following:

- 1) The limited supply of plug-in hybrid electric vehicles (PHEVs) in the market, leading to higher acquisition costs; as well as increased driver pay and driver acquisition costs; and
- 2) Inflation since pricing was last estimated for this service in Fall 2020. Bike rack pricing includes the cost of bike racks, bike rack installation, hitches on the vans, and spare bike racks in case of damage.

Via Transportation is a ride share and technology company and as such is limited to operating passenger-sized vehicles by state mandate. The limited access to PHEVs directly impacted and delayed Via Transportation's ability to acquire Wheelchair Accessible Vehicles (WAVs) to transport passengers with motorized wheelchairs. It is anticipated that more vehicles will be available in FY 2023-2024, but City staff did not want to delay this critical service another year.

Via Transportation has recommended subcontracting with a transit provider that will provide an appropriately equipped vehicle for ADA transport for a period not to exceed one year. This approach will allow Via Transportation and City staff time to further research zero emission WAV options to extend the existing fleet service levels (or to expand as needed) during the project operation period. Such subcontracting

arrangement will be in compliance with all CARB grant requirements, Section 20 of the Contract General Conditions, and all applicable City of Richmond municipal code requirements.
